NDMC is maintaining public greens of approximately 1100 acres area within its jurisdiction which comprise of Gardens, Colony Parks, Roadside trees, Roundabouts, school greens, Greens of NDMC offices, markets and residential complexes, open green spaces etc. Being the capital of the country, it is necessary to properly maintain the greens in the best of shape. The provision of necessary/relevant items and activities is therefore made in this proposal as per budget.

### 4. DETAILED PROPOSAL ON THE PROJECT/SUBJECT

Preliminary Estimate amounting to Rs. 400.00 lakhs including 3%contingencies has been prepared by the department for meeting the annual maintenance requirements of various parks, gardens and other green areas. #### 1. Name of the subject/project

Construction of 440 type-IV (Spl.) Flats at Sec.-14, Dwarka Phase-II, New Delhi.

2. **Name of the Department** : Civil Engineering Department Zone-II

#### 3. **Brief history of the subject/project**

- (a) Council vide Resolution No.11(A-121) dated 18.02.2009, resolved in Preliminary estimate amounting to Rs.190,01,02,000/- with a provision of 9 storied + stilt and community hall with three basements for the construction of 440 Type-IV(Spl.) Flats at Sec.-14, Dwarka Phase-II.
- (b) The proposed quarters are to be constructed on a land measuring 2.79 hectare, which was allotted to NDMC by DDA. Before taking of this project, the drawing were modified as per letter received from DDA and it was proposed with a provision of 11 stored + stilt,, community hall with three basements and an additional room for servant for each flat. Due to which FAR has been increased from 168.76 to 192.82. The cost index has been enhanced from 14% to 36%. Accordingly the Preliminary Estimate has been revised to Rs.282,24,65,000/-.

#### 4. Detailed proposal on the subject/project

(a) As per the Revised Preliminary Estimate, there is provision of 440 Type-IV flats to be constructed in 10 Nos. multistoried blocks i.e. 11 storied + stilt, community hall with three basements and additional room for servant having R.C.C. frame structure with the provision of earthquake resistance, Pile foundation for multistoried blocks and raft foundation of Community Centre, including superior specifications like vitrified tiles in floors, granite stone on top of kitchen counter, stainless steel sink, ceramic tiles in W.C, bath & kitchen and outer finish of stone cladding and item of A.P.P. on terrace with details of works Civil, Electrical and fire fighting which has been prepared to be revised as under:-

Provision of one additional room for servant has been considered by Chief Architect beyond authorization/scale of Type-IV.

The proposal was placed before the Council during its meeting on 20.04.2011 vide Item No.04(A-02) and deferred since the proposal was not addressing the deficiencies of Type-III accommodation. (Copy of the Resolution is annexed at Annexure I, See pages 22 - 24) The proposal is placed again for consideration after addressing the concern regarding Type-III Quarters.

Placed below at flag 'X' is the copy of Resolution No. 04(A-02) dt. 20.04.2011, vide which, the revised preliminary estimate in respect of above said work was placed before the Council for revised A/A & E/S for Rs. 282,24,65,000/-and the case was considered and deliberated by the Council and deferred. In this connection, it is submitted that, earlier the preliminary estimate amounting to Rs. 190,01,02,000/- with a provisions of stilt + 9<sup>th</sup> storied and a community hall with three basements was accorded by the Council vide Reso. No. 11(A-121) dt. 18.2.2009. The same proposal was revised for stilt + 11<sup>th</sup> storied with a provision of an additional room for servant with each flat and community hall with three basements. Considering the enhancement in the cost index, and revised drawing based on use of available FAR, the revised administrative approval was placed before the Council and Council deferred the case since the proposal was not addressing the deficiencies of Type-III quarters. In this connection it is again submitted for consideration of the Council that the scheme is now at very advance stage and the following clearances are with us.

- 1. Height clearance from Airport Authority of India.
- 2. No objection certificate from Chief Fire Office of Delhi
- 3. Scheme supposed to be cleared from DUAC in next meeting. Since all the issues have been deliberated and changes incorporated.

The present position of the proposal could be achieved after dedicated and concerted efforts with respective authorities in last 2-3 years.

It is, further mentioned that the land for the above said scheme was allotted to NDMC by DDA in the month of May, 1996 and the possession of the same was taken over on 10.09.1997. As per the terms and conditions of the allotment letter, the construction as per the sanctioned plan should have been completed within a period of 2 years from the date of taking over the possession of the plot allotted, i.e. upto 10.09.1999, which is already delayed. The NOC from Airport Authority was issued on dt. 15.12.2008 with validity for a period of 5 years from the date of issue to construct a building, failing which, the fresh NOC from Airport authority of India will be required. The validity is likely to expire on 14.12.2013.

To uplift the community facilities for NDMC employees, it was desired to provide an additional facility to the NDMC's residents, residing in NDMC colony by providing gym equipments in porta cabin by developing colony level gym in the NDMC residential complexes. For these purpose colonies having more than 35 houses and not falling in the LBZ Area have been In this connection, as directed, a survey was conducted for entire NDMC colonies to asses the situation to select the eligible colonies for developing colony level gym. After the survey 15 colonies were found eligible for this facility. A meeting was convened by Secretary, NDMC in the Council room on 9.6.2011 with the representatives of Residents Welfare Associations of various eligible NDMC Complexes and various issues regarding maintenance, watch and ward and welfare of the gym were deliberated explored. During the discussion, it was clearly spelt out that the operation and supervision of the proposed gymnasium will have to be undertaken by respective RWAs for which uniform additional fee can be taken from the local families and additional membership fee can be taken by the RWAs from regular users of the gymnasium. All RWAs welcomed the proposal and consented to undertake supervision-cum-operation and requested that NDMC may also consider provision of Security guard-cum-Trainer for the new facility for which suitable deduction can be made from the concerned employees. The minutes of the meeting is enclosed at Annexure 'I' (See pages 28 - 32) for ready reference please. Representative of one Association i.e. from Rohini Complex has refused for this facility. Subsequently, 14 colonies have decided to have this facility for which consent letters from the RWAs are also being received. (Annexure 'II' See pages 33 - 36). List of such colonies are enclosed as Annexure 'III' (See page **37)**.

#### 4. Detailed proposal of the Subject/Project:

The temporary structure of porta cabin of size 18′x25′ is proposed to be provided and in every location of Gym, Four Stations Multi Gym, Treadmill, Elliptical Cross Trainer, Recumbent Bike, Upright Bike and Weight Lifting Benches with Rods of length 5′ and 4′ long with Plates, Dumbles have been taken in the proposal at 14 places/locations (deleting the provision of Gym at Rohini Housing Complex). Further, the life of Gym equipments/Porta Cabin depends upon the maintenance, type of use and frequency of uses etc.. However, prescribed life is not readily available and Porta Cabin/Gym Equipments can last longer if it is correctly put to use and periodically maintained. A Uniform protocols and guidelines to regulate the discipline and uses like payments of electricity/water charges, user fee charges, maintenance and operation, security and guard-cum-trainer including suitable deductions from the employee salary etc. and financial implications on the Gym after the construction will be decided by the Welfare Deptt. before finalization of the tender for colony level Gym in Porta Cabin. Accordingly, an estimate amounting to Rs. 2,05,35,100/- has been prepared for the same.

A copy of DPR for the proposed work is also enclosed at Annexure 'C' for reference please.

Construction of Porta Cabin and provision and fixing of Gym equipments being of different nature and specialized one are proposed to be undertaken separately within the sanctioned amount.

#### 5. Financial implication of proposed Subject/Project:

The preliminary estimate amounting to Rs. 2,05,35,100/- prepared on the basis of DSR-2007 with up to date cost index and market rate duly checked by the Planning has been concurred by the Finance.

Besides this, an additional block is also to be constructed after demolition of the existing service centre and flat (one Type V) to provide more facility keeping in view the increasing population of this area and in compliance of QCI instructions. In this connection, a request of Coordinator (Med./PH) for the above stated work received is enclosed as **Annexure 'A' (See page 42)**. Accordingly, the drawings were also issued by the Architect Department for the construction of additional block including addition/alteration in the existing building. Simultaneously, a request was received to keep the provisions of rain harvesting and an effluent treatment plant. Based on the drawings issued and requirement of medical authorities and QCI a preliminary estimate for Rs. 9.90,79,000/- has been prepared for the entire work.

The proposal has been prepared on the basis of drawings issued by the Architect Deptt for the construction of additional block including additional/ alteration in the existing building. The major components are as under:-

No clearances from different authorities is required, as this is a case of an addition/alteration in the existing building, however, if any clearances is required, the same will be obtained prior execution of the work.

### 3. Brief History of the Subject/Project.

This case is regarding procurement of Winter Livery items for the biennial 2011-2012 to be issued to eligible Group "C" & "D" employees. The quantity has been taken same as already taken for Summer Uniform i.e. for 9000 (7800 Male and 1200 Female) eligible Group "C" & "D" employees of Council.

### 4. Detailed Proposal on the Subject/Project.

A Sub-Committee was constituted for procurement of Winter livery items for the biennial 2011-2012 with the following composition:

i) Shri Ashok Ahuja, Member NDMC
 ii) Director(GA) or his representative
 iii) Director(Finance) or his representative
 iv) Director(Welfare) or his representative
 iii) Member
 iv) Director(Welfare) or his representative
 iv) Shri Subbach Sharma Paragraphative of

v) Shri Subhash Sharma, Representative of Member Employees Union vi) Shri B.S. Bhati, Representative of Member Employees Union.

The Sub-Committee held meetings on 08.06.2011 and 13.07.2011. During the detailed discussion in these meetings, the sub-committee noted that the rates approved by DOPT for procurement of liveries had not been revised for the last 15 years and efforts made for procurement of the liveries on DOPT approved rates by inviting tenders had proved unsuccessful, resulting into none issue of liveries to the employees during 2005-06, 2006-07 and 2007-08.

For the year 2009-10 onwards, the livery items were procured directly from National Textile Corporation (NTC), a Govt. of India Undertaking, and shoes from M/s. Bata India Ltd. in relaxation of provision of GFRs, particularly on the eve of Commonwealth Games to ensure better appearance of NDMC employees for the occasion.

Keeping in view of these issues, the Sub-Committee has recommended that the system of procurement of cloth from NTC and shoes from M/s. Bata India Ltd. may be continued as the feed back received from the employees of the Council is very appreciative and positive regarding quality of the items supplied to them during the last two years. The Sub-Committee has recommended that same material of same colour & composition, which was procured earlier and issued for the preceding biennial, may be procured from the same source and be issued to the employees for the biennial 2011-2012.

Accordingly, sample of requisite items, along with rates, obtained from NTC and M/s. Bata India Ltd. were considered and discussed in detail by the Sub-Committee in its meeting held on 13.07.2011. The Sub-Committee has recommended that the following

items, at the rates mentioned against each, may be procured and provided to the eligible Group "C" & "D" employees for winter liveries for the biennial 2011-2012:-

### **ITEM NO. 12 (L-01)**

### 1 Name of the Subject:

Alternate shops in lieu of units demolished by the Ministry of Defence at Jodhpur Mess under rehabilitation scheme.

### 2. Name of the Department:

Estate-I Department

### 3. Brief History of the Subject:

There were 10 shops in Jodhpur Mess alongwith Pandara Road which were originally allotted by the Ministry of Defence, GOI. All these units were got vacated vide orders of Estate Officer, Ministry of Defence and subsequently demolished by the Ministry of Defence in May, 2010. Sh. K.S. Basra, allottee of Shop No. 2 at Jodhpur Mess is since then requesting for allotment of a unit in lieu of the aforesaid demolished shop by NDMC. A number of references in this regard have been received from the office of Hon'ble L.G. which were examined from time to time and LG office was informed that NDMC does not provide alternate spaces to the allottees of other departments. Alternate units in NDMC are considered only in lieu of units which have been allotted by NDMC and are required to be shifted/demolished for a project/work, subject to availability of vacant units.

As per decision of the Council vacant units in NDMC are allotted through open bidding which is also in line with Section 141(2) of NDMC Act, 1994 after providing due reservation for SC/ST and physically handicapped persons.

Now, Officer on Special Duty to Lt. Governor, Delhi vide his U.O. dt. 12.11.10 has conveyed that Hon'ble Lt. Governor has considered the matter and directed NDMC to allot a suitable shop to Sh. Kuljeet Singh Basra under the rehabilitation scheme as a special case, after verifying the documents relating to possession of Shop No.2, Jodhpur Mess and eviction therefrom. If need be a proposal in this regard may be placed before the Council for their sympathetic consideration and approval.

#### 4. Detailed proposal on the Subject:

Estate Department is of the opinion that NDMC does not provide alternate space to the allottees of other department. It provides alternative units only in case of NDMC allottees who have either been provided units where units have been demolished for a project/work, subject to availability of vacant units. The onus of providing alternate space on rehabilitation basis in this case primarily lies with the Ministry of Defence, who have got these units vacated and then demolished. If we consider rehabilitation of one of the allottees, we may have to consider similar requests of other allottees too and may also set a precedence. However, as desired by Lt. Governor, the case may be placed before the Council for decision.
